APPU Round Tables



Held immediately after the Regional Strategy Conference the APPU Round Tables meeting was attended by 73 delegates from 24 APPU member countries. The major outcomes of the Round Tables were:

- 1. **APPU Reform** The meeting accepted the workplan with Malaysia in charge of the WG on the review of functions and roles of APPU
- 2. **UPU Reform** Members indicated a need for reform of the UPU to streamline decision making processes, a view shared by the UPU Director General
- 3. **UPU Integrated Product Plan** Members called for a World Round Table on the work of the Postal Strategy and Integration Group and impacts on Terminal Dues reform.

The APPU Bureau wishes to thank all delegates for ensuring a lively debate at the Round Tables. There were many divergent views, reflecting the current speed of change in the postal sector.

UPU Regional Strategy Conference

The UPU regional strategy conference was held from 24th to 25th August in Bangkok. The 93 delegates from 27 member countries listened to key note presentations from the DG and Assistant DG of the UPU. After several presentations and a lot of healthy debate among countries the conference culminated in the Bangkok declaration. Key among the declaration was the statement:

"The vision presented in the draft strategy, based on the fundamental pillars of innovation, integration and inclusion, responds to the needs and expectations of the region as regards the future of the postal sector"

Attendees agreed to focus on developing operational efficiencies and eCommerce development and to develop financial services, develop the wider postal sector and diversify into new areas.
