




The capital of Ethiopia is

Coffee was discovered in this country in the Kaffa region












The area of Ethiopia is 1,104,300 sq. km, which makes it approximately as big as France and Spain combined

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















Five missions have been conducted by the IB and Ethiopia Post in order to prepare the Extraordinary Congress, with a few more expected in the coming months










The venue of the event is the **African Union headquarters**, which accommodates, among other facilities, a 2,500-seat plenary hall and a 20-story office tower









Addis Ababa is considered to be a low risk in terms of security threats (Level 2, which is comparable to Switzerland). The African Union Conference Centre is highly secure. All candidate hotels for delegates meet security requirements







Invitation letters have been sent to all UPU member countries. A dedicated registration webpage will be online from early July.





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#### What is the aim of the Integrated Product Plan (IPP)?

The IPP will help UPU members to develop a fully integrated portfolio of physical products (letter-post, parcelpost, EMS) with adequate and competitive remuneration systems that cover the costs of delivering the products







# **Key topics: Integrated Product Plan**

#### Implementation process for the Updated IPP to be submitted to the Extraordinary Congress

#### Implementation of Step 1

<u>September 2016</u> – Approved by Congress

Implementation date – 1 January 2018

Introduction of classification by content –documents and goods

Application of an S10 barcode to small packets containing goods

Survey on mandatory and optional supplementary services

#### May 2017 - Survey despatched

Survey sent to all 192 member countries

81 member countries responded (44%)

Survey results fed into product matrices presented to and approved by the 2017.2 POC

The questions of the impact study were derived from and based on the product matrices

#### **Impact Study**

November 2017 – Study despatched

Draft Impact Study questions were approved by the 2017.2 POC and comments received from S 2 POC and CA C 2 were also taken into account

Study was sent to all 192 UPU member countries

113 countries (59% of membership, spread across all regions, replied to study

11 product-related recommendations derived from the study results have been incorporated into the Updated IPP

#### **Updated IPP**

September 2018 – Updated IPP to be submitted to Extraordinary Congress

#### Mandate C 15/2016

Following on from the comprehensive review that was carried out anon optional and mandatory supplementary services.

Recommendations are to be made to the 2018 Extraordinary Congress and implemented immediately afterwards in order to modernize them in line with market requirements and objectives of the IPP

# Key topics: Integrated Remuneration Plan

#### What is the aim of the Integrated Remuneration Plan (IRP)?

- 1. Modernize, rationalize and integrate the UPU remuneration systems
- 2. Respond to the current and future changes to the UPU product portfolio (IPP)





## Key topics: Integrated Remuneration Plan

### **Milestones**







Phase I (concluded in Istanbul) – 2018 Istanbul Congress adopted terminal dues reflective of format and content (P/G- and E-format rates for "documents"; and E-format rates for "goods" and small packets).

Phase II (to be concluded in Addis Abba) – with data collected through surveys and the outcomes of studies, the proposal on IRP was endorsed by both POC and CA at S3, and is submitted to the 2018 Congress (including remuneration responses to the IPP proposed new product matrix).

Phase III (to be delivered in Abidjan) – with the 2018 Congress adoption of the IRP, further studies will be conducted accordingly for the development of a proposal on an Integrated Remuneration System (IRS) for 2020 Congress, which will seek the endorsement of POC and CA at S7.



## Key topics: Integrated Remuneration Plan

### Remuneration responses to the IPP's proposed product matrix

IPP recommendations	Remuneration responses *
IPP recommendation 1 Items for the blind contain goods	Apply E-format rates in the Convention
IPP recommendation 2 M bags containing goods	Apply M bag rates in the Convention
IPP recommendation 3 Tracked service mandatory	Apply SRP conditions and bonuses in the Regulations **
IPP recommendation 4 to 9 Review various add-on services	Rates review to start once product specifications are finalized

<sup>\*</sup> All services of the proposed portfolio have existing remuneration in force until 2021. The implementation of the IRP consist in studying and reviewing the rates of all services for the development of the Integrated Remuneration System (IRS) to be submitted to 2020 Congress



## Key topics: UPU Reform

### **Proposals to Extraordinary Congress 2018**



### Intergovernmental nature of the UPU:

UPU should remain an intergovernmental organization and specialized agency of the UN

Decision in 2018 Extraordinary Congress



#### Structure of the UPU:

There should be functional separation (and not legal separation) between the governmental and operational pillars

Decision in 2018 Extraordinary Congress



#### Pillars:

- \* Enhanced authority for governmental pillar on cross-cutting matters
- \* Elections: 48 seats and simplified methodology for operational pillar, and 3 additional vice-chairs

Decision in 2018 Extraordinary Congress



### **Coordinating Body:**

\* Current Coordination Committee should be retained with its existing functions and composition

Decision in 2018 Extraordinary Congress



### **Mid-term Congress:**

- \* Mid-term Congress to be a permanent feature
- \* An assessment of the 2018 Extraordinary Congress required to fully ascertain the need


## **Key topics:** Reform of the Contribution System


### Why is Reform of the Contribution System needed?

- Continuous decline in the number of contribution units (-10% from 1997 to 2017)
- Arbitrary and volunteer funding principle used by UPU no longer provides for a stable, solid and predictable funding base of the Union

### **Next steps**


Continue the work of the task force in order to:

- ✓ Assure acceptance of all basic principles
- ✓ Look for a consensus on the system (hybrid ?)
- ✓ Look for a consensus for a transition period
- ✓ Put in place a contingency plan

Further detailed work is needed to reach broader consensus on details:

- ✓ Caps and floors
- ✓ References: GDP, GNI, postal index, UN

### Key topics: Future Sustainability of the Provident Scheme

### Why is Future Sustainability of the Provident Scheme needed?

- Transition to IPSAS accounting in year 2011 revealed historically accumulated significant underfunding of UPU Provident Scheme
- Despite existence of statutory guarantees for the Fund, approval for recapitalization of the Fund has not been achieved.
- Actuaries may further review the estimated shortfall up to CHF 64 million







### Key topics: Future Sustainability of the Provident Scheme

### Option 1:

**Objective:** Recapitalize the Fund for immediate stability with a view to remain independent

85% rate = CHF 15.3M

2018 = minimum CHF 5.2M




### Option 2:

**Objective:** Recapitalize the Fund to join UN Joint Staff Pension Fund (UNJSPF)

100% rate = CHF 64M

2018 = minimum CHF 5.2M







## Key topics: Future Sustainability of the Provident Scheme

### Option 3:

**Objective:** Modify statutory funding rate to 80% and implement 2% corridor approach, whereby variation of actual funding beyond 2% below the statutory rate triggers immediate and mandatory activation of statutory guarantees by member countries
