South-South and Triangular Cooperation (SSTC) is our vision



In **South-South and Triangular Cooperation (SSTC)**, traditional donor countries and multilateral organizations facilitate South-South initiatives through the provision of funding, training, management and technological systems, and other forms of support *to share knowledge*, *skills*, *resources*, *and successful initiatives* in different areas.

SSTC involves 3 actors: 2 from the South and 1 from the North. The latter (can also be an international organization) provides the financial resources so that the countries of the South can exchange technical assistance on a specific topic.

"Nothing for me without me" is the voice of the South in the development cooperation field. Within this framework, the UPU has developed its strategy for the SSTC.

UPU's commitment to the SSTC





Abidjan Postal Strategy (2022–2025) lays down the development cooperation between UPU member states based on the SSTC mechanism.

In order to support the achievement of Postal Vision 2030, the UPU is expected to "...seek to offer postal sector stakeholders quality advice, training and technical cooperation options to support them in navigating the challenges and opportunities of a fast-changing sector."

The UPU Congress has emphasized on this methodology to raise resources for beneficiary developing UPU member states. The focus is *to support* their relative initiatives and to align them with their national priorities by applying a "bottom-up" development approach.

Subject: Appeal for contributions to the UPU Special Fund for development cooperation activities within the framework of South-South and triangular cooperation

Dear Sir/Madam,

First, I wish to reaffirm my commitment, in my capacity as Director General of the Universal Postal Union, to leading and overseeing the successful implementation of the Abildjan Postal Strategy 2022–2025. This strategy sets out a vision of the Post as an essential driver of sustainable development, and invites governments to do everything possible to reduce the gaps in postal development around the world.

During the previous cycle, the UPU implemented a number of excellent projects under South-South and triangular cooperation, as follows:

- COVID-19 recovery project to supply IT equipment to 19 small Island developing states (SIDS), least developed countries (LDCs) and landlocked developing countries (LLDCs);
- Project to provide training for postal officials from developing countries;
- Project to provide training equipment to the Asian-Pacific Postal College;
- Supply of 200 green computers, donated by a member country, to designated operators (DOs) in the Pacific region (an example of a contribution in kind).

Other important projects are currently under implementation, including a project to assess the types of government/social services that can be provided by post offices in order to meet the social responsibilities of member countries' governments in fulfilling the UN Sustainable Development Goals and to enhance postal revenue.

The UPU is currently devising several useful projects to enhance postal IT infrastructure among SIDS, LLDCs and LDCs. Furthermore, it is preparing projects aimed at upgrading postal infrastructure through the provision of postal equipment, particularly for countries that have suffered significantly as a result of COVID-19.

It is important that the world community now come to the aid of DOs, particularly those in SIDS, LLDCs and LDCs. It is essential to support these DOs in every possible way. This contribution may be in cash or in kind. In particular, the UPU would like to upgrade both physical and IT infrastructures in these countries.

During 2017-2021, the UPU implemented the following important projects:

- COVID-19 Recovery Plan to supply IT equipment to 19 SIDS, LDCs, and LLDCs;
- Provision for Personal Protective Equipment (PPE) to the LDCs and SIDS to protect the postal staff from Covid.
- Interactive Online Training Programs (IOTPs) at the APPC for developing countries: 422 participants, 8 IOTPs in 2020 and 17 IOTPs in 2021;
- Operational Readiness for E-commerce (ORE);
- Training for postal officials from developing countries at APPC;
- Training equipment for the APPC;
- LDC Action Plans for 11 DOs;
- Special Project for the Pacific Islands;
- 200 green computers to DOs in the Pacific (contribution in-kind);
- Desk Study of the situation in Asia pacific on the role of postal sector in fulfilling its social obligation in 2019;
- Workshops for Postal Financial Services
- Workshops for e-services and diversification



UPU's focus on SIDS, LDCs, and LLDCs in the current cycle


"The UPU is originally a technical organization that ensures that the technical, not political, matters are solved.

In the current cycle, **the UPU focuses on the development of SIDS, LDCs, and LLDCs**. Therefore, the UPU DG issued a special appeal to all UPU members to assist the DOs of these countries financially: "It is important that the world community now comes to the aid of DOs, particularly those in SIDS, LLDCs, and LDCs. It is essential to support these DOs in every possible way."




UPU Asia-Pacific planned project budgets 2021 and 2022






- Postal infrastructure upgrades for efficient mail operations in 18 LDCs, SIDS and LLDCs in Asia-Pacific.
- This project will help to facilitate all other projects aimed at improving the quality of postal service in the region.
- A special project is being developed for Tonga, in cooperation with UPU's Disaster Risk Management team to help the country recover from the underwater volcanic eruption and tsunami (January 2022).

Project budget: 1,000,000 CHF






- Operational Readiness for E-commerce (ORE)
 "Operational efficiency and e-commerce development" in 24 Asia-Pacific countries.
- The project "Postal infrastructure upgrades for efficient mail operations" will help to meet the goals of the ORE project.
- UPU's PAP team is likely to get more funds for this project as has been the case in the last cycle.





- Capacity building for postal officials at the APPC in 29 Asia-Pacific countries (19 LDCs, SIDS, LLDCs, and some DCs based on the analysis of the countries' training needs).
- This project concerns various subjects related to postal operations, e.g. customs, international mail accounting, compliance, standards, environmental sustainability, etc.)

Project budget: 140,000 CHF





Other projects in Asia-Pacific in the current cycle:

- Evaluating government / citizen services provided by the postal sector (ongoing since the previous cycle);
- IOTPs on digital strategies and terminal dues (ongoing since the previous cycle);
- Remuneration and Strategy Roundtable;
- Training programs/workshops for postal officials in cooperation with the APPC on:
- international mail accounting (IMA);
- environmental sustainability;
- e-services and digitalization;
- the provision of social and governmental services by post offices;

Projects under planning:

- Postal Financial Services (PFS);
- Domestic Postal System (DPS);
- Support in reduction of carbon emission among the Posts in SIDS, LDCs, LLDCs by the supply of electric / carbon-neutral equipment;
