First of all, let me take this opportunity to thank you for your continued engagement and support in the work of the Asian-Pacific Postal Union.

As we approach the conclusion of the Bangkok Cycle of the APPU (2023–2026), it is time to collectively chart the course for the next phase - the APPU Strategy 2027–2030 and the longer-term APPU Vision 2030.

While no formal strategy was adopted at the Bangkok Congress in 2022, it was strongly felt that to steer the Union in a clear direction and to deliver tangible outcomes for our member countries, a well-defined and member-driven strategy is essential. This effort marks a new and deliberate shift one that seeks to formalize strategic guidance through approval of a Strategy at the upcoming 14th APPU Congress in 2026, with progress reviewed annually by the Executive Council.

To initiate this important process, the APPU Bureau is pleased to launch a Member Consultation Survey. This exercise is the first step in building a strategy that reflects the real needs, expectations, and ambitions of our member countries, with the Bureau committed to supporting its implementation.

We kindly invite your postal administration to participate in the survey attached to this letter by sharing your insights on strategic priorities, key challenges, desired support from the Bureau, and your vision for the Union's evolving role in both regional and global postal development.

Your inputs will directly inform the preparation of the draft Strategy and Vision. Preliminary findings and proposed themes will be discussed during a dedicated session during the 2025 Executive Council Meeting in Ulaanbaatar, Mongolia, on 3 July 2025.

If desired, Ministries, Regulatory Authorities, and Designated Operators may submit separate survey responses.
